You do NOT have to suffer and you don't have to be afraid.

Our position on domestic abuse and violence is as steadfast and robust as ever: it has no place in our society and it will not be tolerated.

Abuse in any form – physical, emotional, financial, sexual or psychological – must be reported.

To perpetrators of domestic abuse – hear us loud and clear: arrest awaits.

Our message is simple:

If you are the victim of domestic abuse, call.

If you suspect you know about someone suffering domestic abuse, call.

Our pursuit of domestic abusers is relentless – Coronavirus has not and will not change that.
